- 3. Why is Rachel seen (in Jewish tradition) as a woman of intense suffering and a powerful intercessor (pp. 167-9)?
- 4. How are Rachel (OT) and Mary (NT) connected in the tragic story of the massacre of the infant children by King Herod (pp. 170-171)?
- 5. How does John's vision of the woman "clothed with the sun" (Revelation 12:1-3) link Mary with Rachel (in Genesis) (pp. 172-173)?
- 6. How does seeing St. John as the "Beloved disciple" at the foot of the Cross point to Mary as the New Rachel?
- 7. How does Mary as the "new Rachel" help us understand her as the Mother of All Disciples, the Mother of Sorrows, and our Maternal Intercessor in Heaven (pp. 178-184)?
